	Voice to Parliament: What if the Yes and No sides got together to find a way forward?  The <i>common-enemy identity</i> politics tries to unite a coalition using the psychology of <i>us versus them</i> which leads to a mindset that life is a battle between good people and evil people. A <i>common-humanity identity</i> seeks to find common ground based on shared values.  The long-term benefits of the Voice in Parliament cannot be achieved through political processes alone but must involve a commitment to truth, shared values, and personal change.
