We have already collected many items this year to send. This year a dentist also donated 500 toothbrushes and tubes of toothpaste.

Anetta Dolo lost both her parents as well and is the oldest of her six siblings. She was forced to grow up quickly in order to care for her siblings, relying on the support of her other relatives. Many more children were left without their parents after Ebola swept through the country. Their families are looking for ways to pick up the pieces.
