The "tea gathering for peace" was hosted by Grenadian Permanent Representative to the United Nations H.E. Mr. Denis G. Antoine and Nigerian Permanent Representative to the United Nations H.E. Mrs. U. Joy Ogwu. The event took place on December 2, 2015, on the 21st Floor of Nigeria House, the Consulate General of Nigeria.

After that, Mrs. Lynn Walsh, on behalf of Dr. Taj Hamad, the secretary general of the UPF Office of United Nations Relations, expressed appreciation for all the participants' hard work for the sake of the world, and invited everyone to enjoy peace through tea.



Mrs. Kyoko Sato explained "the way of tea," gave insights into the Tea Ceremony and introduced Mrs. Fumie Watanabe, the tea master. Mrs. Watanabe invested her heart to decorate the venue with flower arrangements (ikebana), colorful origami and items of Japanese art. She also chose special bowls and made tea for each participant with utmost sincerity.

After tea, Mr. Andrew Miyamoto performed the song "Edelweiss" on the trumpet, which was appreciated by all the ambassadors, as the lyrics include the message "Bless my homeland."
