Religious Leaders Gather for Second Indian Interfaith Peace Initiative Conference

New Delhi, India—On the occasion of the UN International Day of Peace and International Day of Non-Violence 2016, UPF held its second Indian Interfaith Peace Initiative conference on the theme, "Role of Religious Leaders in Peace Building and Human Development." The conference took place on September 30, 2016 at the India Habitat Center, and is the continuation of the Indian Interfaith Peace Initiative, which was launched in August 2015 in the presence of Dr. Jitendra Singh, minister of State for the Prime Minister's Office of India; Dr. Thomas G. Amb. K. V. Rajan, a former Indian diplomat.

All the speakers thanked UPF for the Indian Interfaith Peace Initiative and the initiative's work to promote interfaith harmony and cooperation for peace and human development. Each speaker also emphasized the important role religious leaders can play in promoting the initiative. During the program, Dr. Bhardwaj was appointed as an Ambassador for Peace.
