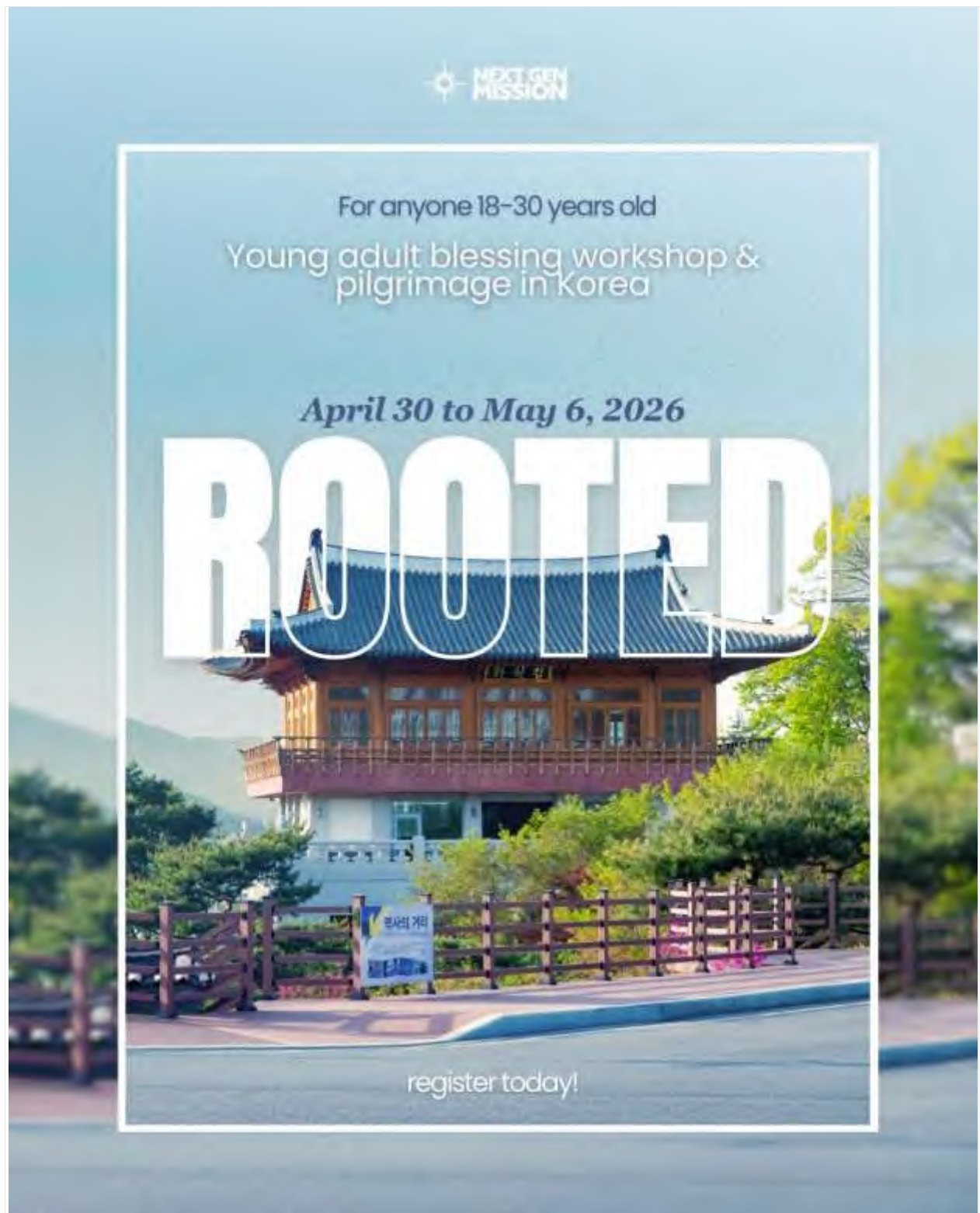


## Junior Class Missionaries
