




Love and Peace in the Eyes of Rev. Moon

A volume with 92 quotes about true love and peace from Rev. Moon's autobiography illustrated through 92 Arabic calligraphies.


A beautiful introduction to Rev. Moon's world of thought

About the artist

Qais Saidi was born in Iraq in 1952.

He received his Ph. D. in Educational Psychology from the University of Baghdad in 1989 and worked as a Professor of Educational Technology in Iraq and some other Arab countries.

Due to the persecution that he and his family suffered in Iraq, they were forced to flee from their homeland and sought refuge in Germany in 2001.

In Germany, he worked as a teacher for Arabic and lectured at the University of Cologne and the Free University of Berlin. As a calligrapher with professional skills in Arabic calligraphy, both classic and modern, he contributed his expertise to teach Arabic calligraphy at the University of Tübingen.

For his social and cultural activities, as well as his engagement in the interreligious dialogue, he has been designated as an Ambassador for Peace by the Universal Peace Federation (UPF) since 2008.
