

Ukraine WFP volunteers help war victims with evacuation and support

As the war in the Ukraine continues to rage, our WFP sister Anna K. is in the Western part of Ukraine, near Lviv, and still continues her work with WFP. She shared with us several reports about their recent activities:



In the first half of March 2022, WFP-Ukraine joined the territorial defense as volunteers to support victims of the Russian military aggression.

We helped with the evacuation and provide humanitarian and psychological support to more than 50 large families, families forcibly relocated from Kyiv, Kyiv region and other regions to western Ukraine and EU countries.

WFP volunteers joined with the weaving of protective nets and making several hundred cans of meat stew for fighters on territorial defense.

WFP helped with disposable tableware and canned food to the center for IDPS in the western Ukraine, which serves more than 3 thousand internally displaced people.

In cooperation with the Polish Humanitarian Staff, WFPW volunteers provided Ukrainian citizens who had arrived in Poland with basic necessities and helped to find temporary accommodation. In cooperation with partners of the city of Zhytomyr, the Women's Federation organized a corridor for transporting medicines to Ukraine for local residents

In the second half of March, more than 200 boxes of medicines were delivered by volunteers of the Women's Federation for World Peace to the local outpatient clinic and the territorial defense of Petropavlivska Borshchahivka in Kyiv, as well as the hospital in Chernihiv. As pharmacies are seldom open during hostilities, civilians and the military need additional support.

We thank our volunteers and partners of the Center for Academic Culture and Local Initiatives "Czasoprzestrzen" in Wroclaw for their support. Cooperation continues and the next collection of necessary humanitarian aid to Ukraine is underway
