

WFP Ukraine: We woke up to the air raid and distant explosion sounds

Last week was really hard. On October 10 early morning we woke up to the air raid and distant explosion sounds. We went to the shelter and learned that Ukrainian cities, in particular Kyiv and Lviv, were subjected to massive missile attacks. That day Russia fired 84 missiles. As a result, we lost electricity, water, Internet and even mobile communications for the whole day. We went to the town, but it seemed to have died out: everything was closed, the streets were empty, and kilometer-long queues lined up at gas stations for fuel. Everything was like at the beginning of the war. We did not have a sufficient supply of drinking water, so we had to draw water from a well.



The massive missile attacks repeated during the week, so we didn't have electricity from time to time.

Since October 10, 30% of Ukrainian power plants have been destroyed. The government of Ukraine has asked all citizens to be prepared for an outage of electricity, water and heat.

Despite all the difficulties we tried to cheer each other up. We continued witnessing and educational activity, made kimchi for everyone and organized a volleyball competition for our community.
