and communities can play in raising a generation prepared to contribute positively to the world around them.



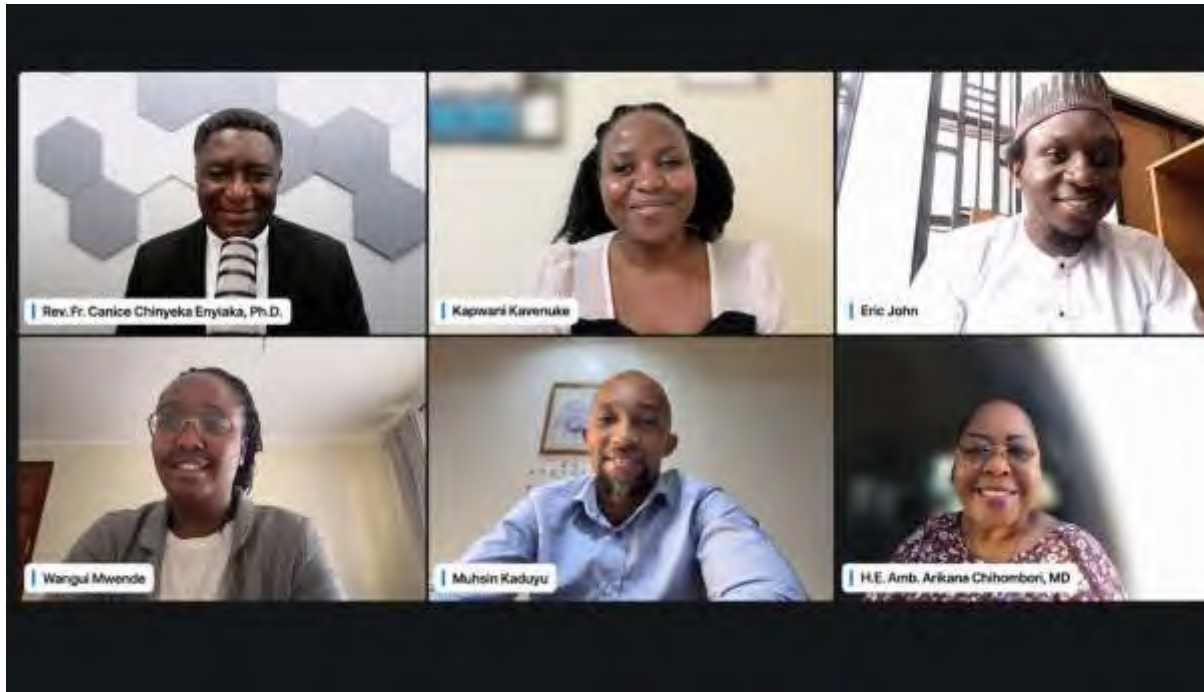

Featuring a keynote dialogue with H.E. Ambassador Dr. Arikana Chihombori, Founder and President of the African Diaspora Development Institute, the conversation explored the challenges facing young Africans and practical ways they can contribute to Africa’s development.

Young participants moved beyond listening to asking questions, sharing their perspectives, and reflecting on their own responsibility in shaping their communities and countries.
