**T** rue Father was released from Danbury Prison  
on August 20, 1985 and it took 13 months  
after he entered the prison.

After that, many prisoners were moved

True Father's speech and followed him.



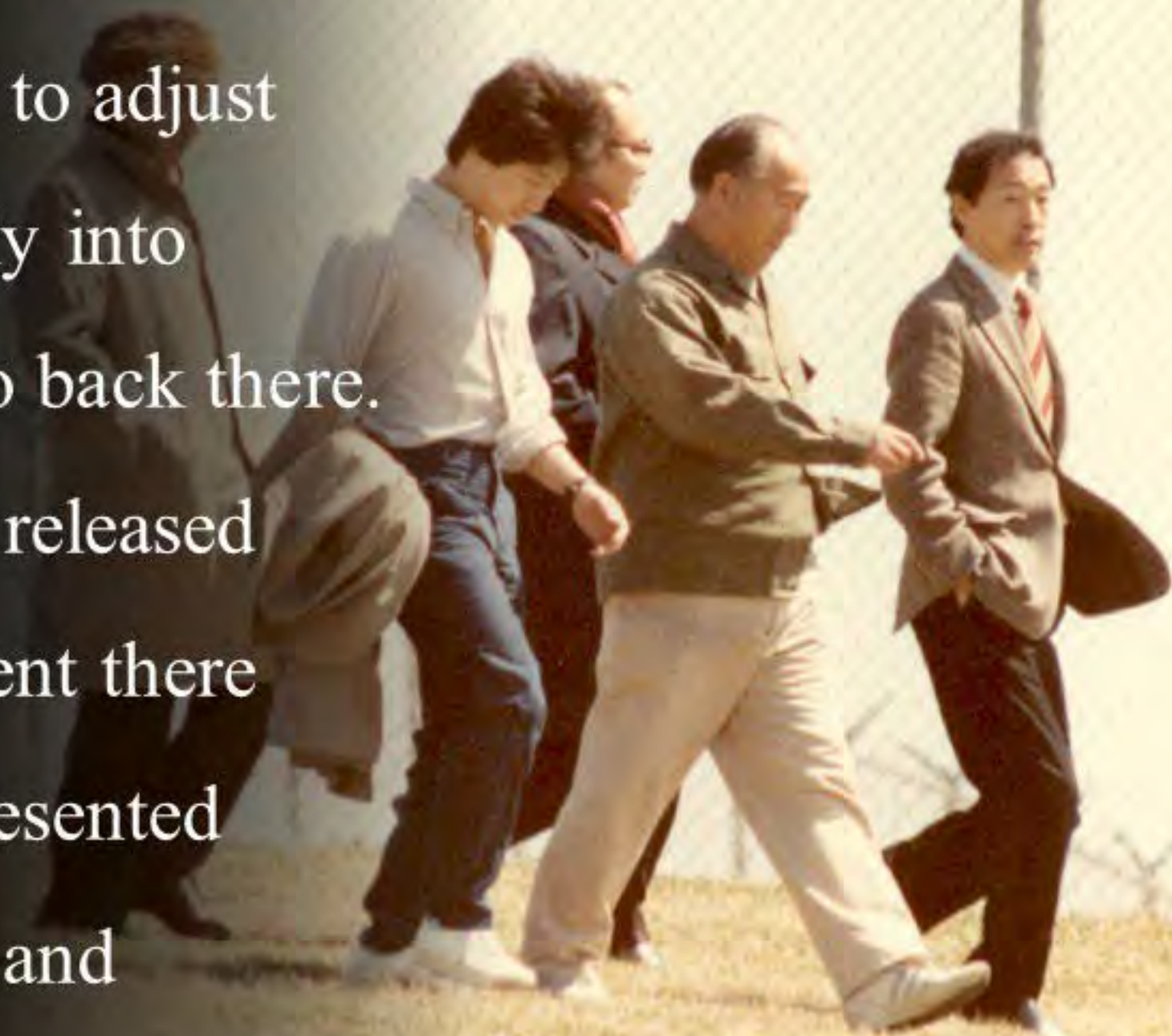


**W**hen True Father was in the prison, he gave many instruction to True Mother.

The proclamation of the opening gate day, publishing the sermon books, the instruction of the aid Nicaraguan Contras, launching an international coalition dedicated to homeland defense, and the proclamation of the end of Communism.



On July 4, 1985,  
True Father moved from  
Danbury Prison to  
Halfway House where is  
prepared for prisoners to adjust  
physically and mentally into  
a society when they go back there.  
Until True was Father released  
from the prison, he spent there  
for 43 days and it represented  
3 days after Jesus died and  
40 days of Jesus's resurrection.

True Father indemnified the cross through  
the Danbury Prison and resurrected what Jesus could  
not. This is the first step for Eastern Unification  
church culture to lead a society instead of Western  
Christian culture society.

I have suffered imprisonment six times in my life. As in the past, I had moving experiences with God during this time in prison. I was not there because of my personal actions or mistakes, yet I did not brood with resentment or hatred for those who persecuted me, nor did I spend my time in prison pleading my innocence. Rather, I dedicated my time in prison to prayer and meditation to understand what America needs to do to fulfill God's Will for the world.
