After all, True Father was arrested on suspicion of Syngman Rhee's spy and take to the Daedong Detention Center in Pyongyang on August 11, 1946. After releasing the Daedong Detention Center on innocence, True Father was sent to Heungnam Prison again on Feburary 22, 1948 after 15 months.



Even though True Father suffered torture, he prayed for God "It is not the time for rest. I still have the mission and I promise to fulfill this mission for you."

After all, when True Father left the prison, all 12 disciples who follows True Father. True Father's difficult prison life represents the indemnity course which find the 12 disciples who Jesus lost during the cross course.



T rue Father set the foundation to start again the True Father's Public course by completing all courses and he left the Heungnam Prison on October 14, 1950.

My transfer in shackles from Pyongyang Prison to Heungnam Prison took 17 hours. What do you think was on my mind as I rode in that vehicle? I felt so miserable, thinking of God who would have to see me in this situation. He had no one but me to restore through indemnity the 6,000 years of His providence, yet I ended up in this kind of situation. I was the only one who knew what should be done for God. Can you imagine how serious I must have been as I looked at the fields and mountains through the window? At the time, I was shackled in the vehicle together with a violent thief. As I sat there, I wondered with deepest seriousness, "How can I surv these circumstances?" (221-068, 1991.10.23)
