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

eorge H.W. Bush, the 41st president of the United States, told the 25th anniversary gala for The Washington Times on May 17 that when the Cold War raged, he and President Reagan before him were supported by "a newspaper that would stand for free people."

Mr. Bush said that while other newspapers raised fears that the Reagan administration was leading the nation toward a nuclear holocaust, the fledgling newspaper stood firm in support of the nation's security.

"Then a funny thing happened: Freedom prevailed," Mr. Bush said.

Mr. Bush grew philosophical as he reviewed the quarter of a century he and the newspaper shared. "This is truly a cathartic experience for me. It's been 14 years since I left Washington behind and, to be honest, when I left the White House after the 1992 campaign, I did not feel particularly charitable towards the Beltway press corps.

"For four years as president, and for eight years before that, I had been subjected to some tough treatment at the hands of the Fourth Estate. Even my friend Wes Pruden managed to zing me from time to time. I still recall how Wes once pegged me as the see 25th Anniversary on page 14



FOUNDER'S DISCOURSE ON UNIFICATIONISM

IORNING ADDRESS

This is from an address given at Cheong Jeong Goong—

the Orignal Peace Palace and Museum, Korea—on April 17, 2007. These notes are taken from a simultaneous translation. Simultaneous translation is done in summary form and depends greatly on the translator's ability to communicate the essence of the message. These cannot be published as definitive texts and should never be used in the future as an "official" publication on Rev. Moon's words. rue Parents offered the morning prayer and pledge to God. Father and Mother came out to the warm welcome of several thousand people at the Original Peace Palace and Museum. They lit the seven candles at the beautiful offering table. Then the True Familv bowed to God and the whole congregation bowed, followed by three representative nations of Korea, Japan, and America, the Continents, the Spirit World representatives and the Abel world and the Cain World)

True Father's Address:

We are proclaiming the Pacific Rim Era in God's providence. We now have



seven years of time until January 13, 2013. During this seven-year period, you are responsible to untangle all the things that have bound your nations. The time is coming when God will directly govern this world. The time is coming when Satan will have to pack up and run away. We are now facing the most decisive moment in God's providence. This is the time of a great showdown between heaven and earth.

Throughout my entire life I have talked and prayed without ceasing. I understand how to make people happy through my words, yet I ask you to not be proud or think you are great. Please be humble. Is there anyone here older than I am? (Mrs. Park Jung Min raised her hand.)

Are True Parents one person or two?

(They are one). You should be able to answer this without hesitation. I ask you to listen closely to the speech I am giving—The Providential View of the Pacific Rim Era in Light of God's Will: The United States and the Future Direction of the United Nations and the Free

We must understand the Pacific Era in the "light" of God's will. This speech was first delivered on March 17th in Hawaii. Then I will deliver this today and then again on May 17th in America. America is closely watching what I am doing.

Why was God's will not fulfilled through the Roman Empire? Because Jesus was rejected and killed. After thousands of years of preparation, God watched Jesus' each and every action. God was looking so carefully at Jesus. Jesus' death was a tragedy that broke God's heart.

This is Heaven's decree. America was raised by God and brought to the place of victory. The key to America is unifying Christianity. How can we unify Christianity? Through practicing true love, understanding the Spirit World, and establishing true families. You must understand about the cross and the need for absolute sexual morality. ighting lamps, building bridges, filling in holes, and finding a common home were some of the images expressed by the 200 Ambassadors for Peace and ACLC members who participated in the April 10-16 peace mission of the Middle East Peace Initiative (MEPI). They came from forty nations in the Americas, Europe, Asia and Africa to take part in the Universal Peace Federation's initiative to bring together leaders from faith traditions and civil society to augment the work of peace in a key trouble spot of the world.

Following the pattern of the peace missions that began in May 2003, people went to holy sites honored by Jews, Christians and Muslims and met with local religious, political and civic leaders. They engaged in dialogue, went on peace walks, participated in seminars, and shared prayers, meals and accommodations.

People's hearts have been touched by the repeated visits from Ambassadors for Peace coming from six continents. "Welcome to Jerusalem, a holy land. You are filling up the holes," said Sheikh Abdul Aziz Bukhari, head of the Naqshabandi Sufi method in the Holy Land. Four-time Jerusalem city councilman Dr. Eliezer Glaubach reported, "There are endless barriers in the world, between races, between languages, between cultures, between religions. Sometimes between men and women. The world is being handled in a system which is unbearable. Each of you who is coming to the Holy Land is led by some providential power to bring hope.'

Asserting that human beings are essentially spiritual in their nature, MEPI works on the premise that a lasting peace in the region can only be reached by a commitment to address all the root causes of the conflict. These include not only economic, political and military factors but also religious, spiritual and historical grievances that have been left untended for too long.

It was a significant time for peacemakers to be in the ever-changing arena of the Holy Land. MEPI operates on the principle that interreligious and international cooperation are essential to building genuine peace. Recent political developments included the March 15 formation of a Palestine unity government and the March 29 affirmation of the 2003 Arab Peace Initiative at the Arab League summit in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. In a breakthrough of interreligious relations, the Vatican ended its annual boycott of the Holocaust remembrance ceremonies and sent a representative to the Yad Vashem service in Jerusalem.

Ran Cohen, a member of Knesset of the Meretz-Yachad Party, said at an April 11 briefing that the Israeli occupation of the Palestinian territories had led only to misery for everyone and that "each suffers from different things, but both [sides] suffer. Yet, we have the best chance for peace in the Middle East." Taleb Al Sana, the longest-serving Arab member of the Knesset, also saw hope in the Arab League initiative. "One of the main issues is that no one wants to talk to their enemies," he said. "But I'm asking, how can we have peace if

no one wants to talk?"

MEPI patiently pursues dialogue with the whole range of religious traditions, even though it is sometimes difficult to digest the contents. At one briefing, Sheikh Taysir Tamimi, head of the Shari'a courts of Palestine, expressed a surprising interest in dialogue with Jewish people, even the extremists, adding, "I learned many things about peace from this movement."

Azam al-Ahmad, deputy president of Palestine, from the Fatah Party, stated at an April 14 MEPI briefing, "We want to cooperate with the Israeli state and live at peace with Israel." The following day, Israeli Prime Minister Olmert had a meeting with Palestinian Prime Minister Mahmoud Abbas that was scheduled to cover the less sensitive issues between the two sides. However, the New York Times reported that it was "the first time since January 2001, he said, that an Israeli prime minister and a Palestinian president had addressed fundamental issues."

People gained new perspectives of history as they saw the land and met its people. Ambassador Pellumb Khufi, member of the Parliament of Albania and former Ambassador to Rome, said, "After this visit to the Holy Land I have to reflect differently on history. It's different when you touch reality with your own hand. I am touched by the reality in the Holy Land." A historian by training, he said he had visited nearby Bosnia in 1995, after the war, and described the landscape as apocalyptic. He quoted U.S. President Bill Clinton's comment that "we won the war, and now we have to win the peace." Other students of history remarked that Muslims have lived in peace with Jews and Christians for centuries and it can happen

A number of participants in the peace mission had personal experiences living in lands of divisions and war, such as Germany, Bosnia, Sudan, Korea and Guatemala. Rajinder Singh, an educator living in Birmingham, England, spoke of growing up in his native Punjab when it was one land but now experiencing the pain of a divided land.

"This organization taught me so much patience," commented Haitham Bundakji, vice-president of the Islamic Society of Orange County, California. Born in Jordan after his parents fled Palestine in 1948, he said, "Seeing all the obstacles and suffering, I get upset, but I have been learning how to be patient and work hard for peace."

Rt. Rev. Riah Abu El-Assal, former Anglican bishop of Jerusalem, referred to the special challenges faced by the dwindling numbers of Arab Christians, who constitute barely 1.5 percent of the population of the Holy Land. "I have been detained many times at the airport," he said, "and I tell them, 'No matter what you do, you can never make me hate you.' St. Paul wrote: 'God was in Christ Jesus reconciling the world to himself, and he has given us the ministry of reconciliation. There were two events in Bethlehem 2,000 years ago: the birth of Jesus and the killing of the babies by King Herod. Rachel is still weeping. How can we put an end to the misery of the mothers of Bethlehem? Jews, Muslims and Christians lived in

this land for thousands of years. The two women who came to King Solomon both claimed to be mother of a baby. The real mother said, 'Don't partition the baby.' To enable two peoples to live side by side is not the mission of the politicians but of the children of God."

Baruch Shalev, president of the Israeli Institute for Strategy for Peace and organizer of service projects bringing together Jewish and Palestinian youth, said: "Without true reconciliation we will not have true peace, not in our families or in our nation or region. Reconciliation is not a political exercise but rather a spiritual, emotional and moral effort that encompasses forgiveness, compassion and a will to leave behind the past and build for the future."

In a briefing with Israeli leaders, Hyun Jin Moon, son of MEPI founders, Rev. and Mrs. Sun Myung Moon, quoted a poem written by his father at age sixteen:

If I believe, I am deceived.

If I love, I am betrayed

Suffering and grieving tonight, my head in my hands..

But when I love those who acted against me,

I brought victory.

"The words [of the poem]," he said, "are poignantly related to the problems of this region."

Poet Shelly Elkayam, an Israeli Jew, resonated with the MEPI principle that the highest standard in human relationships is to live for the sake of others. "It sounds simple, but this is the answer to our problems," she said.

"You can make war in a second, but it takes time to make peace" the deputy mayor of Bethlehem, George Sa'adeh, told the people on the peace mission. His 12-year-old daughter was killed in 2003 when soldiers fired on his car by accident. Israeli members of Bereaved Families Forum who had lost a child reached out to him. Now he compares making peace to raising a child.

This resonates with the MEPI principle that the family is the central institution of all societies and is the "school of love and peace" for the growth and development of all people. "What happened to me gave me more faith in God," the leader from Bethlehem said. "I am devoted to peace for my neighbors." Former Knesset member from Jerusalem, Walid Sadik, also?promoted a long-range view of peace: "The more things we resolve, the better the legacy we will give to our sons, our children and ourselves, too."

People coming from the United States brought their touchstones of inspiration. There were frequent references to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Donzella James, former state senator from Georgia, Dr. King's home state, commented that there are many walls that are invisible and they are coming down. She quoted Dr. King's saying: "The arc of the universe is long, but it will bend toward justice." Although the conflict in the Middle East is sometimes described as a conflict among Judaism, Christianity and Islam, with a common lineage through Abraham, insights from other traditions can be helpful. Mahatma Gandhi's warning seems relevant: "If we practice and eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth, soon the whole world will be blind and toothless."

The search for peace in the Middle East involves the heirs of Abraham's faith. "Therefore, we must turn to God, we must find our common roots,' explained MEPI Committee co-chair, Rev. Michael Jenkins. "In our scriptures there are common roots, common truths, that bind us together, and though the tensions are great through dialogue and serving the needs of the people we can dissolve the tension and become one family. At the Dome of the Rock the faithful come and pray, while other sons of Abraham come and pray at the Western Wall and at the Church of the Holy Sepulcre. Eventually we want to see these prayers being made in a place where no guns are no longer present."

Even pop music can be enlisted in the cause of peacebuilding, as reflected in Archbishop George Augustus Stallings' quote from the lyrics of Michael Jackson: "I'm starting with the man in the mirror."

In the course of the seven-day peace mission, an imam opened a gathering with recitations from the Qur'an, a rabbi chanted a blessing over the breaking of bread, and a Christian pastor illustrated a point by singing a Gospel song. The roles sometimes rotated, as the tasty and diverse spiritual diet was complemented by abundant daily buffet meals of vegetables, fruits, breads and meat.


There seems to be no end to the walls going up and houses being torn down. One Israeli said that the sense of loss from the Holocaust grows more painful with each passing year. Among the international representatives who laid wreaths at Yad Vashem in Jerusalem for Holocaust Remembrance Day, April 16, were two participants in the peace mission, from the United States and Somalia. Hod Ben Zvi, secretary general of the Universal Peace Federation in Israel, said, "Both of my parents were Holocaust survivors. Their parents died in the death camps. If people of faith had embraced each other seventy years ago, this horror could have been avoided. Let us liberate our ancestors, our descendants, and ourselves."

In the midst of the painful memories are also hopeful stories. There is a growing awareness of the need to help Israelis, including the third of the Holocaust survivors who are living in poverty. Muslim leaders are raising funds to construct a center for Jewish-Christian-Muslim dialogue and understanding in the Bustan el-Marq area of the Galilee, near historic sites honored by Jews, Christians and Muslims. UPF's representative in Gaza, Kamal Thabet, has been able to provide food for more than 200 small children per day.

MEPI staff member Donna Selig talked about her heart being torn and pulled each time she comes on a peace mission. "It's like a measuring scale. One side can pile up all the injustices, hurt and pain, and the other side piles up injustices, hurt and pain. Eventually the scale will topple over with the weight. What we need to do is melt it with repentance, forgiveness and love." Judith Anne Ratte of Pax Christi spoke of people's need to empty themselves and allow God's reconciling love to guide them in the journey to peace.

Jerusalem resident Rachel Glaubach said, "When I see the faces of our international sisters, I feel hope. You left your families to see first hand how difficult and dangers it is here. And yet you came to comfort those who are in pain and build understanding so we can work for peace in this land."

People on the peace mission had their own stories to tell. A Palestinian, Dawud Assad, former president of the Council of Mosques in the U.S., referred to 39 members of his family who had been killed in the conflict, yet he has dedicated himself as an Ambassador for Peace.

People brought wisdom from their various traditions. Dr. Henry Lozano, member of the Board of Directors of the U.S. Corporation for National and Community Service, referred to the Native American Lakota people, who say that people of four colors had been scattered to four directions of the earth, blacks to the south, yellow to the east, red to the west and white to the north, and that one day they will all travel home and renew the circle once more, so that the four children of the earth may all live well, altogether.

MEPI upholds the principle that there is one God who is the Creator of all and the parent of all humankind. Muslims working for interreligious reconciliation quote from the Qur'an: "Oh people, we have created you from a single pair of a male and female, and made you into nations and tribes so that you may know each other, not that you may despise each other. The most honorable of you in the sight of God, is the most right-

eous" (49:13). A frequently-quoted passage from the Bible by people pursuing peace is Psalm 133, which begins with the words, "Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity."

MEPI programs often include interreligious dialogues. "The Jewish-Christian dialogue I participated in with MEPI was excellent," reported Dr. Bertil Persson, from Sweden. A professor emeritus of the University for Peace (UNESCO), he participated in a recent MEPI fact-finding tour. "I am very impressed by MEPI as a pedagogical project to create a new culture of peace, beyond all barriers between people."

After a week in the Holy Land, Brandon Jessie, a computer consultant from San Francisco, summed up what he learned: "Nothing made by man is worth dying for. Not a temple, not a wall, not a grave site."

Complex questions were aired during discussions with local leaders: What do the Israelis want? What do the Palestinians want? Who built the wall? What tangible changes need to take place to reduce people's fears?

One speaker offered an answer that is perhaps simplistic: Palestinians are entitled to a home; Israelis are entitled to security. Security comes from reconciled neighbors. Yariv Oppenheimer, General Director of Peace Now, said, "The difficult task of the peace camp in Israel is to convince Israelis that if we make peace and give back these lands that there will be peace and security afterwards."

Other questions seemed to have no

good answers: What are the prospects for a viable Palestinian state? How long will militants uphold a ceasefire without tangible benefits? What is the impact on the young people?

Not everyone agrees on the relative importance of religion and politics in the conflict. "We don't see this conflict as a conflict between Israelis and Palestinians," said Dr. Muli Peleg, professor of international relations at Tel Aviv University and co-chairman of One Voice Israel Palestine. "It is not a conflict between Jews and Muslims. It is not a conflict between right wing and left wing, extremists and moderates. And we believe that on both sides of the divide most people are in anguish and would like to see a way to move forward to a different future."

While peace in the Middle East may seem a distant dream to many, Edgardo Castro, special assistant to the speaker of the House of the Philippines, Jose de Venecia, made an analogy to the movement to promote an interreligious council related to the United Nations, an initiative spearheaded by the Philippines. Such an interreligious council could assist the UN in more effectively dealing with issues such as the Middle East.

In December 2006 the General Assembly adopted by consensus? a Resolution co-sponsored by 51 member states on "Promotion of Interreligious and Intercultural Dialogue, Understanding and Cooperation for Peace." The resolution calls for convening a high-level dialogue on interreligious and intercultural cooperation for the promotion of

tolerance, understanding and respect on matters of religion, belief and cultural diversity. It also requests the Secretary General to designate a focal point in the UN Secretariat for following up on interreligious, intercultural and intercivilizational matters.

As a participant in the MEPI peace mission, Ed Castro expressed confidence that drawing on interreligious resources to promote peace in the Middle East is a realistic process.

It remained for each participant to ponder another question: how are Ambassadors for Peace to learn to love and dialogue with the extremists on both sides?

Advances in science and technology are not paralleled by advances in meeting human needs and reconciling enemy people. The United States is one key to the relationship between Israel and the Palestinian territories. "America needs spiritual guidance; then it will use its might for the sake of world peace," MEPI Chair Dr. Chang Shik Yang told international delegates. "We have to make a spiritual foundation, then heaven will guide this nation in the right direction. Then this will be a true holy land."

"When you came the first time, there was no hope," commented Abouna Hatoum, Melkite Catholic priest from Nazareth. "All factions were hopelessly entrenched in their positions. Now I believe that because of these pilgrimages everything is opening up. It is truly amazing. We do not talk about peace, we do the work of peace; we 'do' the peace." *

A Meeting with Dr. Bo Hi Pak

n a recent trip to Korea we had the honor of visiting with Dr. and Mrs. Bo Hi Pak, our beloved elder brother and sister and pioneers of the American movement for True Parents. We went together to see him with his brother Dr. No Hi Pak, who is a major leader of FFWPU in Korea. Both he and Mrs. Pak were so happy to see us and to hear about Ameri-

Dr. Pak listened with great interest as we shared about True Parents' foundations in America and how so much is developing so quickly -- from the clergy to the Ambassadors for Peace to our work in the education of key American leaders. As soon as we met, so many wonderful memories were naturally recalled of all the battles that were fought and won centering on True Parents, from the media to AFC to the movement of CAUSA and the clergy.

Dr. Yang at Northern Virginia Family Church

n Sunday April 29, 2007, our Continental Director, Dr. Chang Shik Yang, spoke to the Northern Virginia Family Church in Fairfax, Virginia. Dr. Yang recently returned from an almost three-week trip that took him to several countries in the Middle East, including Turkey, Israel and Palestine.

Following his return, the Continental Director immediately went to Virginia Tech, where he prayed for the victims of this unspeakable tragedy and for the perpetrator.

At Virginia Tech, Dr. Yang prayed and laid 33 bouquets of flowers, one for each victim of the tragedy including the shooter. He also signed the big Virginia Tech memorial quilt.

In Northern Virginia, Dr. Yang started his sermon by reading from the Old Testament, He spoke about the source of conflicts, which emanate in the human Fall and the fallen nature of human beings. Tragedies like this one, he explained, are reminders of the kind of world we live in. He dug into the Holy Scriptures to highlight God's response to tragic moments, made up of forgiveness and love.

Some highlights of Dr. Yang's message include:

- The human Fall as the source of conflicts in human life and tragedies like the Virginia Tech shooting
- Condemnation, sorrow and regret about the shooting
- Compassion for victims, their families, the community and the whole nation
- God's response in the wake of such tragedies: forgiveness and love (God's conversation with Cain after he murdered Abel, the Angel of God's message to Hagar fleeing from Sarai)

Dr. Yang offered insights on how to resolve conflicts in human life:

- Blessing as the way to sever our ties to Satan and engraft ourselves to the new tree of life
- Following the original mind and conscience

Dr. Yang also shared about the Middle East Peace Initiative (MEPI) tour with family members. The last MEPI tour took him to several countries including Turkey, Jordan, Israel and Palestine

He insisted that political solutions alone are not workable in this region. The basis of peace here lies in the communion of the three Abrahamic faiths, Judaism, Christianity and Islam. While in the Holy Land, Dr. Yang, Hyun Jin Nim and tour participants met with many dignitaries including President Mahmoud Abbas and prominent Jewish, Christian and Muslim leaders.

Dr. Yang finally updated family members on the upcoming world tour and read from the speech to be delivered at this occasion.

Testimony by Rev. Hiroshi Goto, pastor, Virginia Family Church

Dr. Yang, visited the Virginia Tech campus and the memorial on campus to the massacre of 32 students on Saturday before our service. The massacre and tragedy on Monday, April 16 that









was so much in the national media hit really hard in our community here in Northern Virginia. The killer, Cho's, family lives in Northern Virginia, where there is the largest Korean population in the area. There were eight students among the 32 killed that were from our Northern Virginia community. Some of our second generation went to school with the victims in past years.

We have five BC students who are attending Virginia Tech from Northern Virginia Family Church community – a total of six BCs that are attending the school from Virginia. On the day of tragedy, I recalled that one of the parents could not reach his daughter, who was attending Virginia Tech as a freshman. Her dormitory was the first place where Cho killed two students. She has

been living only one floor above where the killing of the first two students took place. We were praying for this family as well as all others in the campus. She later contacted her father. When he called me to tell me that she was safe, I felt that tons of burden were lifted. Truly our families were blessed and safe. But for eight other families in our area - and 33 altogether - the

fear and pain had just begun. Interestingly, the family of Cho was under police protection, having to move every day to a different place because their lives were so threatened. And the Korean community, in general, was devastated thinking that one of their own could do this.

With this background, you could see we were so grateful that Dr. C. S. Yang, representing the True Parents' heart and the American movement, visited the Virginia Tech campus to pray for those who died a few weeks ago. He shared his pain and determination that we should expand and reach out beyond our community so that we can influence the future direction of families in this strategically significant area, a center of influence to American leadership.

As it is the tradition of True Parents, whose sense of responsibility is so strong that they feel they were totally responsible for such tragedy, we resolve to love our neighbors so that our prayer and love would prevent such tragedies as this. It was good day of prayer and recommitment for us toward our larger community.

In addition, Dr. Yang shared with the Northern Virginia Family Church his inspiration of visiting Turkey – meeting Korean War Veterans who fought to liberate Korea and True Father, the former first lady, and key religious leaders in the country. His PowerPoint presentation of the most recent Middle East Peace Initiative was very informative to all gathered there. •





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Second Generation National Blessing Workshop

During the second evening, all hearts were warmed with laughter and sharing as Towa and Kwonsu Lee talked about their own walk in the Blessing. Also, first gen testified with anecdotes shared his testimony of discovering his own personal identity as a Blessed child and provides another model and hope for other second gen like him."

As the three days came to a conclusion, our hearts were not only uplifted but our understanding made clear. Many wept during the lectures repenting, refreshing their commitment and cleansing their mind from the confusion of the world they face each day. The strong and powerful preaching was followed by the joyous and graceful praise dances offered by the Christ Liberty Tabernacle Praise Dancers, a troupe of four women and eight girls. Whirling throughout the sanctuary to the inspiring rhythm and words of "This is the Day that the Lord has made" and additional songs, the dancers wove ribbons of color and the Holy Spirit about the audience and served as a beautiful prelude to the final presentation of the morning by ACLC Women in Ministry.

ACLC Women in Ministry coordinators Rev. Reiko Jenkins, First Lady of the National Family Federation for World Peace and Unification, and Rev. Ethel Hayes, copastor of Glory Land Missionary Baptist Church in Houston, shared deeply about their calling to strengthen, encourage and support

Pastor Lankford was both eloquent and passionate in speaking to the theme of "Actions Speak Louder than Words: Serving the Needs and Needy in our Community." For example, three 11-yearold boys recently broke into and burglarized HO, causing \$30,000 in damages and losses. Pastor Lankford knew that if he called the police (my natural response!) these African-American youths

would probably be on the first step to a life of crime and incarceration. So, instead, he decided he would care for the future of these young men and has lovingly worked with them and their parents and grandparents ever since, teaching them life skills, academic knowledge and practical applications learned from the Bible.

After that, instead of leading the Holy Blessing part of the program himself, Reverend Cotter asked and empowered Rev. Andre and Carla to lead the explanation and ceremony. One guest reflected that, "I really enjoyed myself today, and I liked the marriage blessing ceremony the most. Because marriages are in such turmoil today, it is always refreshing to see people who try to stay together and work out the many challenges of marriage, with God being their helper ... I know this group will prosper and continue to be richly blessed."

The Holy Spirit was overwhelmingly present throughout this morning, as evidenced by the fact that three pastors signed and paid their entire membership fees; two clergy were inspired enough to offer to host an upcoming ACLC prayer breakfast.


Afterwards, many people remained to talk more and were given a tour of the various services that HO offers to the community. We were grateful to view the medical wing of the building, the health exam room, the barbershop, the weight room, etc.



Finding good foster parents is something churches and other religious organizations els of this partnership of governmental agencies anywhere. We are welcomed because we bring to the table diversity and a true, family-oriented perspective.

In addition, as a Bay Area Family Church member commented, "The clergy and people working with Healthy Oakland deal with the consequences of the Fall (drugs, alcohol, abandoned children, broken families) without clearly knowing the root of sin. We need to work together with them and be sure to teach them the main point of Father's teachings - the Fall."

Our next ACLC prayer breakfast will be the first to be held in San Francisco itself. Led by Rev. Cotter, many of us often went to pray up on Twin Peaks in San Francisco the first 43 days he came here several months ago. As anyone who sees the current moral degradation of that city knows, San Francisco is a good place for lots of prayer and for many a prayer breakfast!❖

As these fine ministers of the Word of God testified to True Parents and filled the program so well, our visiting District Director, Rev.


Timothy Henning, and staff could enjoy themselves just attending the program. Rev. Mark Tengan, however, could not contain himself being in the audi-



He came all the way from New Jersey to guide our families (12 in attendance, 20 adults and 10 2nd Generation) to accomplish their mission to build CIG by creating the ideal family and achieving Tribal Messiah ship, especially after the Special

Amnesty Workshop.

The first presentation focused on a deeper understanding of the providential course of our True Parents in the time of restoration throughout the period of the indirect dominion of God and the new Era of CIG and its meaning from 2001 until 2013. The presenta-

tion was very revealing and it helped all of us to understand our role in this course of restoration and CIG better.

The second presentation was about CIG and the CP (Cheongpyeong) Providence. Rev. Kim shared the Principle understanding of CP Providence and the identity and mission of CIG own-

ers. The role of Blessed Central Families is crucial. We are the bridge to testify to True Parents. There are many Absolute Good Spirits in the spiritual world but they can't testify to the people on this earth without our cooperation. Spirit world is working very hard and the spirits are very serious to support our

outreach activities. We need these Absolute Good Spirits.

The third presentation was after our lunch break. We learned about the topic of Ideal Family and 2nd Generation. We need to come to recognize how important it is to have our concept changed about the ideal family. The ideal is not connected with the principles of restoration. Cain and Abel form the vertical relationship in the realm of restoration. In the era of CIG we need to understand the concept of subject and object. We have to build unity. We have to understand some major points to build unity. That is the keeping of the heavenly constitution, the attendance of Sunday service, tithing, HDH and pledge, love for each other, removing our fallen natures and keeping our original mind (conscience). It was very helpful to clarify the understanding of the meaning of violating the heart of others. It is often confused with individualism. If we don't have a vertical standard in our relationships, there is no ideal family. If we give up caring for our children, we are violating the heart. We need to always understand our moti-

vation.

We had a lot of chances to also get questions answered. It helped us to see more clearly what our responsibility is in this new age. It is important to understand that building CIG does not mean doing our own thing without the alignment with God's will. So we talked about the issue of decentralization, which is not total independence; it is about interdependence. We still need to respect our leadership.

At the conclusion Rev. Dong Woo Kim elaborated about the HDFC Providence. He explained about the Sphere of Life vs. Public Sphere. We need to build up a system to succeed in HDFC. Some people are disillusioned if we don't bring the results, but happiness comes from doing the right thing.

We were very blessed to have Rev. Dong Woo Kim in NC. All participants felt so grateful to have had the chance to learn this crucial content and gain a better understanding about our own role and responsibility. Members commented that they felt resurrected through the presentations

Korean Ambassador for Peace Inspires Southern California Communities

spiritual whirlwind blew across the Pacific on March 20, the first day of spring, as Southern California welcomed our Ambassador

for Peace from South Korea, Dr. Young Kyung Yoo. A university professor in the field of business administration, Dr. Yoo brought such great warmth and enthusiasm to his role of Ambassador that he not only gave presentations throughout the region, but he also personally invited nine guests to the major Los Angeles event.

His welcoming dinner, held at Pasadena House Peace Embassy, proved to be an occasion when Los Angeles area Peace Ambassadors could network with one another and

share their own experiences of becoming Peace Ambassadors. Ms. Norma Foster, president of the local United Nations Association, commented that she, too, just as Dr. Yoo had testified, appreciated the fact that Father and Mother Moon value all the world's great religions and never berate the faiths of others. Dr. Piara Singh, a local Sikh leader, remarked on the similarity between the five key points of AFP and the Sikh beliefs.

The following day, Dr. Yoo spoke at the weekly Divine Principle lecture and discussion program led by Rev. Timothy Henning, District 12 director, and held at Bishop Juergen Bless's Old World Village Community Church in Huntington Beach, Orange County. The Peace Message contents sparked a lively but profound session among the ministers and guests about the importance of lineage, tradition and ancestors. Rev. Chang Woon Jeong, Korean Family

Church of Los Angeles leader who accompanied Dr. Yoo to all his events, and Father Pedro Contreras contributed deep insights from the Asian and South American perspectives. In Bok Ross provided excellent interpretation for Dr. Yoo and traveled on with him and



Rev. Jeong to San Diego for the day's final events.

That evening, Rev. Walter Frank and the San Diego Family Family Church hosted Dr. Yoo at an intimate dinner with local Ambassadors for Peace and ministers followed by a packed event at the church. Dr. Yoo signed brotherhood papers with Chief Clayton Two Bears, bringing together two brothers of the greater Mongolian clan. Assistant Pastor Marcus Beresford testified to the value of Universal Peace TV (UPTV.org) as an incredible resource for all our Universal Peace Federation work. The San Diego program featured the video "What is True Peace?" directly downloaded from the UPTV web site.

Dr. Yoo's final full day took him to an Ambassadors for Peace luncheon in the vibrant Koreatown area of Los Angeles. Organized by Rev. Jeong and Mrs. Susan Lee, a longtime community activist and principal of the Seonghwa Korean School, the mid-day program drew many prominent Koreans, including one of Father Moon's former high school roommates

That evening, Dr. Yoo spoke with several hundred guests, including nine of his family members and graduate school alumni friends. Held at the Tem-

ple City Seventh Day Adventist Church, the program featured not only Dr. Yoo's testimony and the reading of Rev. Moon's Peace Message, but also the appointment of three new Ambassadors for Peace. Dr. Yoo himself helped present the honors, starting with the newly elected Mayor of Temple City, Ms. Judy Wong, a guest of Gayokla Nichi Ayala, one of our key Native American Leadership Alliance leaders. Mayor Wong remarked how impressed she was with the crosscultural efforts that were evidenced

by the diverse people gathered for the evening. In addition, two local activists, Ms. Michele G. Dulac and her daughter Solange Morton, working for the sake of youth in the Southland, became Ambassadors. A Bridge of Peace ceremony between Dr. Yoo and Dr. Dietrich Seidel, a professor of the Unification Theological Seminary, completed the evening. Myung Ja Ashworth effectively interpreted for the evening as participants shared their personal insights into the process of building intercultural relationships.

Dr. Yoo ended his sojourn before heading for his flight home with a Friday morning roundtable breakfast attended by several key Ambassadors for Peace, including Ted Choi, a Pasadena Human Rights Commissioner, with whom he had attended graduate school.

Los Angeles has been called the capital city of the Pacific Rim, and the Southern California members truly reflect all the nations of the Rim. As

Rev. Jeong and the Korean Family Church members worked together with Rev. Henning, Keith McCarthy (the secretary general of the Southern California UPF) and the rest of the District 12 staff members and volunteers, we could truly feel the energy and effectiveness that working in harmony generate.

Perhaps the most inspiring aspect of the entire four days, though, was Dr. Yoo and his own personal testimony. His humble sincerity about what he had learned through the education he received as an Ambassador for Peace-despite his impressive educational and professional credentials--won the hearts of all the people he met. As part of his testimony, he read a poem from the 1913 Nobel prize-winning East Indian poet, Rabindranath Tagore that refers to Korea's role in bringing light to the world:

The Lamp of the East

In the golden age of Asia

Korea was one of its lamp-bearers And that lamp is waiting to be lighted once again

For the illumination in the East.

Where the mind is without fear a

Where the mind is without fear and the head is held high;

Where knowledge is free:

Where the world has not been broken up into fragments by narrow domestic walls;

Where words come out from the depth of truth;

Where tireless striving stretches its arms towards perfection;

Where the clear stream of reason has not lost its way into the dreary desert sand of dead habit;

Where the mind is led forward by thee into ever-widening thought and action;

Into that heaven of freedom, my Father, let my country awake. \diamondsuit



'commodore of the Kennebunkport Yacht Club,' and I do not think he necessarily meant it as a compliment.

"The editors and the editorial writ-

ers of The Washington Times understood the stakes of the Cold War and were not the least bit shy about voicing their support for national leaders in the two great political parties who were trying to end the threat posed by the Soviet Union."

Rev. Sun Myung Moon followed with

a 35-minute Founders Address to the audience of more than 2,000, who dined on roast beef and salmon at the National Building Museum. He acknowledged his 88 years before beginning his address, delivered in Korean with simultaneous translation into English.

"Please do not miss your chance to

ride on the currents of heavenly fortune that will surge together during this important and sacred year," Rev. Moon said. He said the future of American security lies in the Pacific Rim.

Wesley Pruden, the editor in chief of The Times, thanked Rev. Moon for the gift of the newspaper to the nation, for his support over 25 years and for the guarantee of editorial independence that has enabled the reporters and editors to put out the newspaper the old-fashioned way without fear or favor.

"We only work to the old newsroom adage that 'if your mother tells you she loves you, check it out,' " he said, to laughter. "Rev. Moon has always understood that."

Tom McDevitt, the president of The Times, and Michael S. Steele, the former lieutenant governor of Maryland now the chairman of GOPAC, presided as masters of ceremonies. Mr. Steele, an original subscriber of the paper, told the crowd that he keeps his first edition of The Washington Times, dated May 17, 1982, wrapped in plastic.

"The Washington Times never wavered to bring readers the highest quality of news," he said. "That's what we salute tonight."

Mr. Steele read a letter from President Bush, who said The Times' "efforts help advance the ideals that make our nation strong."

Margaret Thatcher, the former prime minister of the United Kingdom, sent greetings in a video that was projected onto several large screens.


"As long as The Washington Times is alive and well, conservative voices will never be drowned out," she said.

The night of celebration would have seemed highly unlikely 25 years ago, when newspaper executives typically predicted that it would last six weeks in competition with The Washington Post.

Four community leaders—Robert L. Woodson Sr., Douglas M. Johnston, Gregory H. Stanton and Michele Weiner-Davis—received the newspaper's inaugural Founding Spirit Awards, recognizing their work in community activism.





You Can Grow Younger, Live Longer

ost of our Western leadership and members are now in the fifties. True Father has invested everything in us and he needs our contributions for many years to come. The second generation also needs us there for them as grandparents and mentors. This also a is a time in our lives we know the most and have the most to give. Therefore, this is a time to get serious about our health.

There's good news. While the conventional Western wisdom is that from your fifties your health will gradually and inevitably begin to decline, this is not true. At this time you can actually grow younger ie. rejuvenate your body and be and feel healthier than you ever have in your life. Practicing the best of exercise, thought and healthy diet practices, you can "grow younger." This is my personal experience of the last ten years.

A Long and Healthy Life is Not Just for Orientals

We already know this from observing our elders like Reverend Kwak and so many other Korean and Japanese leaders who are making vital contributions and working hard into in their fifties, sixties and seventies. Not to mention Father who is the champion of youth and energy at age 87. But we may have thought – well, those are the oriental genes and diet. And indeed the Korean and Japanese have good genes and their national diets are the healthiest in the world. However, there is a movement in the West of cutting edge health experts that are also achieving long life and measurably "growing younger". We in the West can also live long healthy and productive lives way into to our later years.

The United States medical establishment is proud of how long Americans live- but what really matters is not how long someone lives, but until what age a person is healthy and active. Americans are living longer, but the average 65 year old takes 5- 10 medications-ie he is not well. People are living longer, but most in their later years are not active and healthy mentally and physically.

Ten years ago I began to have some aches and pains I had never experienced before and I even had some minor memory problems. Regular doctors told me that this decline was normal. Observing our Oriental elders, I could not accept that. So I began to read about health and apply what I learned. Of all I have read and applied I found the books of two persons in the health field to have the best ideas: Deepak Chopra, who presents a simplified ideas of the ayuvedic health system and John Gray, of Men are from Mars and Women are from Venus fame whose diet and exercise program melds the best of East and West. By applying their ideas, I have grown younger (measurably in terms of blood pressure, cholesterol, better memory, how I feel). In fact, I feel better now at age 57 than I ever felt in my thirties. I am happier, more energetic and with fewer health problems than at any time in my life.

A Way that is Inexpensive and Takes Little Time


Unificationists usually have no time and often no money. More good news: the things I have learned are cost very little and take little time. They do take "smarts" and the motivation to live a long and healthy life

A friend of mine who was helping at a recent speech of Father's in an American city last year, was awake at 3:00 am in the morning outside Father's room when the door swung open. He observed Father running around in circles in his hotel room. The point is that after forty, health is not a given, even for Father. Recently Father has spoken about living to 120. He has mentioned on a number of occasions that he has developed his own exercise program to keep young. We need to think and do the same.

I recommend three books- two by Deepak Chopra and one by John Gray.

Deepak Chopra: His best health books are: Perfect Health and Grow Younger, Live Longer.

Perfect Health: Chopra's ideas are not the latest fad but based on the renaissance of the ancient Hindu medical wisdom called ayurvedic medicine. Ayurvedic medicine classifies people into three mind/body types. In Perfect Health you take quiz to see what type you are. Once you know your type, there is a list of what foods and activities are especially good for your type--foods that "pacify" your system, rather than "aggravate" your system. This does not mean some kind of strict diet--you can eat all kinds of food--but you learn which foods to favor and which foods to go easy on. For example, I am a "pitta" type. Reading about my type, I found out that corn and orange juice aggravate me. At the time I was living in Mexico and eating corn tortillas twice a day. I reduced the amount of corn I ate and started drinking other juices. That one change made a big difference in how I felt physically. I began to favor the foods that were good for



my type and found that not only did I feel much better but food cravings decreased. Many of our food cravings are because we are lacking something in our diet or eating the wrong things.

Grow Younger, Live Longer: A very important book because I addition to health recommendations, it addresses the mental changes we have to make to live long and healthy lives. Basically, we have to program our mind and body with thoughts that we will live long and healthy and eliminate all thoughts and words that are negative. No more saying things like "Just another senior moment" "I'm growing old", "Of course I've got health problems- I'm old etc. etc. You have to tell yourself the opposite- I am growing younger everyday, my memory is getting better etc.

John Gray-The Mars Venus Diet and Exercise Solution (book) and The 9 Day Relationship Makeover: (CD Program)

John Gray experienced the same thing we all experience after forty: some health problems and the frustrations of easy weight gain even though he was not eating more than before. He also lost his sight in one eye. He began years of research and world travel to be spiritually healed of his blindness and to find the best diet/exercise solution. He got spiritual healing of his blindness after visiting top spiritual healers around the world. During his travels he studied diet and exercise wisdom which he backs up with modern research. He explains in detail the importance of a diet of nutrient dense foods with a balance of carbohydrate, good fat and protein, the importance of taking supplements of plant based trace minerals (that we need but no longer gets because of modern agriculture techniques) and a very effective and easy exercise program exercise program you can do at home with no equipment. He explains that we are overeating because we are eating too many processed foods that are not nutritious.

Last year, I spent a morning listening to John Gray

at a seminar at the Smart Marriages conference. He mentioned he plans to be healthy and active at age 100 and observing his level of energy, joy and lifestyle of giving, it is believable.

Gray spent 20 years writing books and counseling to help men and women get along and came to the conclusion that a big obstacle to man/woman harmony was the mind/body problem relating to diet and exercise. Thus his new focus on this diet and exercise program: if we feel good physically, we can love.

Gray is not the only American health expert with confidence to live healthy until 100. There are others- like the fasting advocates- fasting regularly for example is another proven life extender.

Gray's book can be bought used on Amazon for \$10.00.

The CD program, called The 9 Day Relationship Makeove,r is \$160 from his website. The CD program is the only place with the information and a presen-

tation on his exercise program. Get it for the exercise program but the diet and relationship information in the CD set are also excellent.

Gray has his own supplement products he recommends including a nutrient dense health shake as a meal replacement. But he also gives you the ingredients so you can make it yourself with things from the health food store. I purchase the shake as a meal replacement and love the taste and how good it makes me feel. His mineral capsules are also a bit pricey and there are similar, less expensive capsules available

EXERCISE

I recommend three exercises: Deepak Chopra's yoga-lite routine as described in Perfect Health, John Gray's exercises, and rebounding.

I am actually am one of those persons who hates to exercise. Nevertheless I do all three of these exercises almost everyday. They are easy and they make me feel great.

Perfect Health Yoga (Lite) Routine: This a very simple yoga 10 minute routine. I am not the yoga type and resisted this for a many years. Three years ago, I started doing his routine everyday and it is a big part of why I feel so good. Anyone can do it although it takes time to do the stretches right-

but you go at your own pace. Yoga is an ancient wisdom and Chopra explains the health benefits of each stretch.

John Gray's Exercise Program- Available only on the CD set The 9 Day Relationship Makeover. The most effective, and easiest exercise program I have ever found. Nor more need to go to the gym or sweat to be fit. Even 10 minutes will do you well. (Unificationists will recognize something familiar in the "body tapping" exercise.)

Buy a Rebounder: Rebounders are small trampolines. You can buy one for about \$160.00. Watch TV and jump on it for 10 minutes and get great health dividends. It is easy and it can be done even by people who are overweight or have bad legs etc. (My sister-in-law has a very bad arthritic hip, uses the rebounder and now looks like a different person.)

Rebounding is a health panacea because the bouncing activates your lymphatic system which cleans out toxins. And even though it does not feel like it, the rebounding also builds strength and muscles. It's also good for your brain. True Father once commented that he attributes his good memory to upand-down action of the waves during his constant fishing activities. Likewise, John Adams attributed his good memory in an old age to the up-and-down bouncing of horseback riding- his passion into his eighties. With a rebounder you don't have to go fishing nor own a horse to get all these benefits.

Rebounding is also an easy way to get a second wind. No matter how tired you are, after 10 minutes of rebounding, your energy comes back.

Walking too: Aside from this, walking (not running) is recognized as one of the best exercises. It is also a good time to chat with a spouse, family member or friend.

Discover Stevia: I have a sweet tooth but I know sugar and artificial sweetners are harmful foods. Ste-

via is a natural herb with zero calories and health benefits that comes in a powder form. It has a slight aftertaste but is worth it because Splenda and Nutresweet are bad for you. In Japan, stevia is wildly popular and the main alternative sweetener.

Throw out the Microwave- I know it sounds radical

We already have the problem of eating too many processed foods which are less nutritious. Microwaving food further destroys nutrients. Eating too many processed and microwaved foods, we find ourselves craving and eating too much food because this food is not nutritious. Your time-pressed family will not like this idea (mine sure didn't), but you'll find a toaster oven will do most everything albeit a little slower. Actually, all of our kids enjoy eating healthy and think it's cool that there family is "way ahead" in this area.

Conclusion--This Takes Time: Changing to our diet, our thinking and becoming a person who regularly exercises is a gradual process that takes time and patience. It is not about denying ourselves but beginning to favor the things that are good for us so that eventually our body craves the good stuff. It took me ten years...I started with small things like favoring juice over diet sodas, eating more fresh fruits and vegetables and gradually switching to whole grains. Today I crave only good things--my favorite sweet is a yogurt smoothie with fruit and sweetened with stevia and my favorite fun drink is a club soda with lemon. Before I would not have believed this possible. I also can enjoy fun food -because of the exercise program my metabolism is efficient, junk food and desserts sometimes is no problem. Who wants to live without pizza and ice cream?

- These groups can also be done with home church contacts, who in essence go through similar struggles and also have answers.

- Everyone will expereince love and a sense of belonging, and the original spirit of our movement of the early days can be

rekindled.

Each meeting was very different in flow and make-up but was powerful, deep, and rich in sharing.

The format is flexible but always has the component of singing holy songs at the beginning with deep fervor and an opening prayer. Then we read always a section of the Peace Message as well as another text, usually on prayer, but also we use books like "The Purpose Driven Life" by Rick Warren and Hying Jin Nim's books, which are excellent for self change. Each person reads one paragraph, followed by discussion. The focus is always how does the word we just read apply to myself and what I am challenged by.

Towards the end of the meeting we ask each person if they have a point or two they need prayer for, especially concerning their own spiritual growth as well as relationships with family and friends. Also I ask each person what is his or her dream or wish and what would it take to realize it. That's usually the best part! The sharing is confidential and so many brother and sisters (guests as well if they are present) open their hearts. There are a lot of different concepts out there about what is prayer, why pray, and how to pray in this era of Cheon Il Guk, and deep realizations are made. We get to know one another in a new and deep way and learn from each other. I only facilitate the process.

I see new life coming to our community through this process, supported by sermons at Sunday services and the support of Rev. Stewart, who is also visiting and nurturing already existing home groups or, rather, Life groups.

Let the spirit of God and your heart guide you!

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

your mom may say, "You are really becoming such a considerate and kind person." What a wonder sign of change!



WAIT team adult coordinator Kate Tsubata started off the March 25 service with a hard-hitting PowerPoint presentation on the impact of AIDS worldwide and close to home.

And after that, the WAIT team never stopped pouring it on. They proceeded to tell the story of the threat of AIDS – and of the hope offered by God-centered self-esteem – through songs, breakdancing, testimonies, rap, and modern dance.

We are changing our focus to create a learning program for those who like the outdoors and are interested in digital art and design.



For our digital art program, we will focus on web design using Dreamweaver, Flash for web animation, Photoshop for image editing, and Premiere and other softwares for video production.


The cost is \$475 a month. Fall program begins Sept. 5th.

Students need to have their own computers to attend the program. A good digital camera is strongly recommended.


