Kenshu Morita, the 3rd son of Kazuya and Yelena Morita, passed away into the spirit world at 8:41pm (Pacific Time) on Sunday, October 3rd. After a series of chemotherapy treatments during the past several months, the doctors at UCSF Children's Hospital decided to proceed to the bone marrow transplant. On Sunday morning however, his internal bleeding became out of control. According to Rev. Thompson, Kenshu was peacefully smiling to his parents as he passed away a few hours later.
