Inauguration of the Assembly of the World's Religions November 15, 1985, New Jersey, United States


On November 11, 1985, the International Religions Foundation hosted the inauguration of the Assembly of the World's Religions at the Americana Gorge Great Hotel, in the U.S. state of New Jersey. Around 750 people from 85 nations attended the seven-day assembly. In his opening speech, "Dialogue and Alliance," True Father emphasized, "The Assembly of the World's Religions must march forward to realize the mission of realizing God's will on earth through the power of harmony." On November 17, 2009, early on a Tuesday morning, True Father signed the cover of the *Tongil Segye* November Issue during Hoon Dok Hae at Cheon Jeong Gung. He wrote, 'The 50th Children's Day, Second-Generation Children 17-24 Blessing,' 'True Parents' Complete Liberation and Coronation and the Completion of True Father's Autobiography in 120 Nations,' and 'The celebration for True Parents overcoming the Cain political world and the eight stages, and the inrush of the ideal era of ten thousand years of victory for the victorious lineage, which is the era of the

True Parents' Commence their Fourth World Tour November 11, 1972, the United States

True Parents departed Seoul on November 11, 1972, beginning their fourth world tour. True Father said, "We must create a global environment and educate a special task force" before he headed for the United States. During their eight-month stay in America, they brought together young European members, held workshops, educated an international task force and conducted other activities, forming an activity base for the world providence.
