Dr. Song Yong-cheon takes office as head of Family Federation's South Korean branch



On 27th August, the South Korean daily newspaper <u>Segye Ilbo</u> published a report under the headline: "<u>Song Yong-cheon</u>
(송용천) <u>Inaugurated as the 21st President of the Korean Branch of the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification</u>". Other media outlets as well covered the event.

From 2023 to 2025, Song served as International President of the <u>Family Federation for World Peace and Unification</u> (widely known as the "<u>Family Federation</u>"). He has now formally taken office as president of the <u>organization</u>'s Korean branch.

In his inaugural address, Dr. Song reflected on the difficult circumstances facing the <u>movement</u> and emphasized the profound weight of his new responsibilities. He remarked:

"In the midst of an unprecedented ordeal where the foundation of faith and life is shaken to its roots, I feel an infinite sense of responsibility in taking on this grave mission."



The news agency News 1 reports that he went on to say,

"At this very moment - the golden age of the <u>providence</u> - it is our mission to widely proclaim the stature and value of <u>True Mother Han</u> and to realize the vision of one family under <u>God</u> and a peaceful world. Let us open the way to the future together as one - with pastors nationwide, <u>providential</u> institutions, public officials,

and blessed families."

According to the <u>Segye Ilbo</u>, President Song also outlined three primary directions that he intends to pursue in order to address current challenges and guide the <u>Family Federation</u> toward renewal and growth:

Establishing crisis response,

Healing the wounds within the community of heart,

Improving organizational culture.

Song Yong-cheon brings with him decades of experience in both domestic and international leadership. A graduate of Kookmin University, he later received an honorary doctorate in theology from the Unification Theological Seminary (UTS) in the United States. His career began as a missionary abroad, after which he went on to hold major posts as continental director of the Family Federation in Oceania, Europe (2003-2013), and Japan (2013-2018). He also previously served as chairman of the Sunhak Educational Foundation (2018-2023), where he played a significant role in advancing educational initiatives aligned with the movement's mission.

Now, stepping into his role as president of the Korean branch, Song faces the task of guiding the <u>Family Federation</u> through a period of testing and transition. With his experience and vision, he expressed his commitment to lead the <u>organization</u> into a new chapter of resilience, unity, and forward progress.

The <u>Segye Ilbo</u> writes that the inauguration ceremony was held at the <u>Family Federation</u>'s headquarters auditorium in Yongsan-gu, Seoul, and gathered an audience of more than 300 people. Among the distinguished attendees were Moon Yeon-ah (문연아), Chairwoman of the Sunhak Educational Foundation; Moon Hoon-sook (문훈숙), Chairwoman of the Hyojeong Cultural Foundation; <u>Doo Seung-yeon</u> (두승연), Director of the World Mission Headquarters; Do Hyun-seob (도현섭), Director of the Future Leaders Training Institute; Lee Gi-seong (이기성), Director of Cheonshimwon; and Jo Manwoong (조만웅), Chairman of the Senior Pastors' Association. In addition, pastors representing <u>Family Federation</u> congregations from across the country participated in the event.








On 24th August 2025, several South Korean newspapers, including the Segye Ilbo, Seoul Economic Daily, Pinpoint News, News Works, Bridge Economy, reported on a significant development within the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification (commonly known as the Family Federation), marking both organizational renewal and a fresh commitment to global peacebuilding.

At a grand inauguration ceremony held at the HJ Cheonju Cheonbo Training Center in Gapyeong, Gyeonggi Province, Doo Seung-yeon (두 승연) was formally appointed as Director-General of the World Mission Headquarters. The event gathered over 3,000 participants, including leaders from Korea and abroad, underscoring the weight of the appointment and the importance of this moment in the Federation's continuing history.

Doo's inaugural address set a clear and inspiring tone for his tenure. Unlike a simple call for expansion, his message emphasized internal development, moral transformation, and a qualitative deepening of the community's life and mission. By framing himself as a "bridge of harmony and love", Doo articulated a vision not only for organizational leadership but for a wider role in healing divisions and fostering peace across cultures and nations.

His focus on "true love" and "true families" as foundational values reflects the Family Federation's long-standing spiritual philosophy, while also directing members' attention to the practical task of embodying these ideals within their communities. In doing so, he conveyed that global peace begins with personal and communal renewal, and that the Federation's example can ripple outward into broader society.

According to the Segye Ilbo, Doo stated,

love, bringing peace to the world."

In Doo's speech, two particular words stand out as indicators of the kind of qualitative change he envisions - "peace" and "harmony." Notably, he did not use the common Korean term for peace, pyeonghwa. Instead, he chose hwapyeong, a word that conveys a deeper, more spiritual and religious sense of peace. Similarly, for

"harmony," he avoided the usual term hwahap and instead used hwamok, which emphasizes harmony within relationships, especially the unity found in families. He added,

"We will restore faith and love for one another, experience the values of true love and true families within our own community first, and through that, create a shared vision that can be demonstrated to society."

Doo Seungveon's emphasis on hwapyeong (spiritual peace) and hwamok (relational harmony) may be understood as directly resonating with Hak Ja Han's call for the world to embrace God's motherly aspects. By

rooted in family and community relationships, Doo's language reflects a nurturing, reconciliatory vision of leadership.

This aligns with Hak Ja Han's teaching that lasting peace emerges not merely from external agreements or structures, but from embodying God's maternal qualities of care, love, and healing within human relationships. In this sense, Doo's speech may be seen as an extension of her providential guidance, situating his leadership within the broader vision of building a world of harmony through the motherly heart of God.

The ceremony itself highlighted the international scope and cooperative spirit of the *Family Federation*. Leaders from Asia, North America, and Japan expressed congratulations and unity, recognizing the need for shared direction under Doo's leadership.

Chairman Masaichi Hori of the Asia-Pacific region praised Doo's integrity and character, qualities that will be indispensable in guiding the organization through a pivotal period of change. The inclusion of symbolic acts prayers, bouquet presentations, benedictions, and traditional cheers underscored both the celebratory and spiritual significance of the occasion. This blend of ritual, fellowship, and missionsetting reaffirmed the Family Federation's commitment to building not just an institution, but a movement grounded in shared values and transcendent purpose.

Equally important was the broader restructuring announced alongside Doo's appointment. The Segye Ilbo writes,

"In addition to the World Mission Headquarters, the Family Federation also restructured its organizational system for the victory of 'Vision 2027', appointing Kim Eun-sang (김은상) as Director of the Central Administration and Do Hyeon-seop (도현섭) as Director of the Future Talent Training Center."

This reflects a forward-looking strategy that balances governance, community building, and the cultivation of new generations of leaders. By investing in administrative efficiency and future leadership, the Federation is laying the groundwork for sustainable growth and continued relevance in an increasingly interconnected yet divided world.

Doo Seung-yeon's background – spanning theology, administration, and international mission work – equips him uniquely for this role. His experience in North America and his prior leadership positions within the *Family Federation* suggest a global perspective enriched by diverse contexts. This aligns with the *Federation*'s aspiration to be more than a Korean-based religious organization: it envisions itself as a global peace movement, capable of building bridges across national, cultural, and religious boundaries.

In sum, the inauguration of Doo Seung-yeon as Director-General represents not just a personnel change, but a symbolic step into a new chapter for the *Family Federation*. By emphasizing inner renewal, true love, and harmony, Doo has set a direction that resonates with both the *Federation*'s founding ideals and the pressing global need for peace. The restructuring toward Vision 2027 demonstrates a serious commitment to long-term goals, ensuring that this movement remains vibrant, united, and impactful. For members and observers alike, this moment signals hope that faith, love, and leadership can indeed serve as bridges to a more peaceful world.
