Empowering Women, Fostering Peace:

Insights from 'No Peace Without Women' Conference in Kosovo"

Pristina, Kosovo—The second annual "No Peace Without Women" conference, cosponsored by UPF and its International Association of First Ladies for Peace (IAFLP), recently convened in the heart of Kosovo's Assembly, drawing influential leaders to explore the role of women in peace processes, conflict prevention, and human security in the Balkans.

Under the theme "What Are Women Bringing to Peace Processes, Conflict Prevention, and Human Security in the Balkans?" the event, held on June 13, 2023, featured approximately 120 participants, including three deputy ministers, 12 parliamentarians, and nine ambassadors from countries such as Austria, Japan, Norway, and Sweden. The conference, a collaborative effort involving the Europe-Middle East branch of Women's Federation for World Peace International (WFWPI) and the Office of the Prime Minister of Kosovo, aimed to address pressing issues in the region.

The conference kicked off on the eve of June 12, coinciding with the 15th anniversary of Pristina's liberation, commemorating the occasion with a welcoming banquet at Hotel Sirius. Dignitaries present included Kosovo's Deputy Prime Minister Emilija Redžepi, former President Fatmir Sejdiu, and former First Lady Nezafete Sejdiu, among others.

Ejona Icka, the secretary-general of UPF-Kosovo, played a crucial role in coordinating efforts, acting as the representative of WFWP in Kosovo and serving as a liaison with the Kosovar government. Gani Rroshi, secretary-general of UPF in Albania and the Balkan Peninsula, supported the initiative, overseeing the Albanian delegation.



The groundwork for the conference was laid during the UPF Peace Summit 2023 in Seoul, South Korea, where Prime Minister Albin Kurti committed to hosting the "No Peace Without Women" conference in Kosovo. The government of Kosovo demonstrated its support by covering conference expenses and hosting a special closing banquet, further highlighting the commitment to women's crucial role in peacebuilding.

The conference comprised three insightful sessions:

- 1. Session I: 1325 / UN Agenda on Women, Peace, and Security
 - Kosovo's Deputy Prime Minister Emilija Redžepi emphasized the importance of equal rights for all citizens, transcending ethnic divisions.
 - Former Liberian President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, through a video message, highlighted the critical role of women in peace processes and the need for their inclusion.

2. Session II: Women in Development, Integration, and Finance

- Flora Brovina, former MP and chairwoman of UPF-Kosovo, shared her experiences during the Kosovo War, emphasizing the power of women in promoting peace.
- Hon. Senida Mesi stressed the economic potential of empowered women, citing the need for a shift in laws and greater female representation in the workforce.

3. Session III: Peace Leadership: Access and Opportunities for Young Women in STEM, Media Literacy, and Information Technology

- Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs Liza Gashi highlighted women's instrumental role in postwar recovery and emphasized the need for increased female representation in STEM fields.
- H.E. Teuta Sahatqija, former Kosovar ambassador to the UN, discussed the initiation of dialogue with Serbia through Serbian women and the importance of tech education for women.





The conference concluded with a vibrant closing banquet, graciously sponsored by the Foreign Ministry of Kosovo. The day's discussions reinforced the pivotal role of women in shaping a peaceful and prosperous future for the Balkans, echoing the sentiment that "No Peace Without Women" remains a guiding principle in the region.

- Bilingual Publication: The publication of lectures in both Albanian and English in special brochures by UPF caters to a broader audience, serving as a reliable reference for scholars.
- Over 150 Citations: The rigor of the authors is evident through more than 150 citations, offering not only scientific accuracy but also serving as an informative source about social science scholars past and present.
- Creation of an Academic Network: The formation of an academic network, especially from the Balkans, fosters potential collaborations for the future advancing not only science but also solidarity, neighborly understanding, and peace preservation.
- Increased Participation of Researchers: The growing number of researchers now part of the Ambassadors for Peace network is anticipated to infuse new ideas, studies, and experiences into UPF's fundamental mission of achieving peace and prosperity in a just world.


