1. TRUE PARENTS AND TRUE FAMILY

- Pray for health, wellbeing, victory of True Parents and True Family
- Plan for True Family's activities in EUME specifically, supporting the UPA missionaries including TP grandchildren
- Sending many hopeful and victorious reports to True Mother
- Being responsive to all directions and guidance from TM
- Presenting plans for True Mother's visit to Europe in Spring

3. (A) IMPROVED WITNESSING RESULTS

1. Develop Divine Principle content that speaks to young people today presenting DP as a source of real-life answers and solutions:

- harmonise the material and spiritual dimensions of life
- nurture the original good mind and overcome the evil mind
- Sustain a personal relationship of heart with God, our Heavenly Parent
- Clarify cultural and ideological confusions, understand their historical roots
- Learn the right relationship between men and woman, intimacy, family love (leading to the Blessing)



3. (B) USER/MEMBER EXPERIENCE AND PATH

- 1. Learn from education and commerce about how to encourage the new user/member to develop their own path
- 2. Realize that full-time single membership is only for a very few
- 3. CARP as an entry point for you
- 4. New membership growth must be sustainable and so there must be a financial component
- 5. Develop simple "Friends of FFWPU" membership sign up

WITNESSING STRATEGY

Key Elements of Witnessing Strategy

- Harmonize Cheonshimwon prayer points with the goals of the witnessing program
- Work with the UPA and other Missionary Teams (GPA, Empower, etc) as a vanguard for witnessing and have our 2nd Generation and young members be inspired to partner with them.
- Develop new presentations of Divine Principle based on True Mother's guidance and research into issues that attract youth. Hold more Divine Principle workshops and train young lecturers to teach.
- Improve our online / social media profile and content so that these support and protect the witnessing effort.








