**FM Radio with wired earphones:** These are essential for translation during the events, so double-check that yours works!

**Personal medication:** Bring any daily or emergency medication you might need - especially for allergies, travel sickness, or pain relief. Many medicines may not be easily available in Korea.

**Entertainment for children:** There will be daily transport between the accommodation and Cheon Pyeong. Bring books, games, or quiet activities to help kids pass the time happily.

**Universal adapter:** Korea uses 220V outlets with type C or F plugs, so an adapter is necessary for charging your devices.

**Toiletries:** While you can buy basics in Korea, you might prefer to bring your own if you have sensitivities or specific preferences.
