

### **Important Tips**


- The cheapest flights to Korea (under €500 return) are through China. It is safe and quick. Go for it!
- Google Maps does NOT WORK WELL in Korea, therefore
- Download Naver Maps instead, install it.
- Get an E-SIM for Korea. I use MobiMatter but there are many options. You will use a lot of data so do avoid roaming
  - You will need data to listen to the translation on YouTube for the evening vigils broadcast from Cheonpyeong
  - You will want to use the Google Translate "Transcribe" option because everything is in Korean. It is only about 70% accurate but it helps.

#### Public Transport from the Airport

- Take the AREX train to Seoul Station.
- There are two options;
  - the non-stop express which requires a separate ticket and is often sold-out. These only run every 40 minutes or so.
  - The all stop local, which is only 10 minutes slower. You can use a regular Seoul Transit Card on this (buy the card at the airport)
- At Seoul Station, take the Subway Line number 4 (light blue)
   South
  - Get off at Indogweon, about 30 minutes from Seoul Station
  - Look for exit 2 and 3, which are next to each other and have escalators










It's 25min walk from Indogweon subway station

### Getting to CP from the Detention Center

- By public transport, it takes about 2 hours
- Take the Number 4 Subway Northbound
- Change at Sadang (about 20 minutes) to the Number 2 (circle) line in the direction of Seoul National University and get off at JAMSHIL
- At Jamshil, you need to find the bus stop for the 7001 bus which goes all the way to the Magnolia Hospital. It is opposite the Lotte Theater (and is different from the place where the 7001 bus terminates when you come down from Cheonpyeong
