Vision 2020 Planning Meeting in Seoul, Korea

Mr. Dong Min Jo reported the Universal Peace Federation strategy

The following is an official report from tongilgyo.org about the Vision 2020 Executive Committee's providential organization strategy workshop held on July 19, 2013 in Seoul.

In Seoul the Vision 2020 Executive Committee's providential organization strategy workshop was held at the 7th floor conference room at the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification (FFWPU) Headquarters on July 19, 2013.

About 40 people from several providential organizations, including the Universal Peace Federation (UPF), Women's Federation for World Peace (WFWP), FFWPU, etc., participated in this workshop to discuss their strategy for Vision 2020.

There were five sections for the meeting and the following was the order of the workshop: 1) Vision 2020 strategy details and progress report; 2) strategy and progress report by providential organizations; 3) strategy discussion; 4) Vision 2020 progress world-wide report and 5) special report.



Secretary General Ms. Young Seon Choi reported the Women's Federation strategy for Vision 2020.

For section one, Mr. Dong Won Jeong, director of the Bureau, reported the Vision 2020 Task Force Team's ongoing projects, which include building a foundation for Unificationism to become a popular national religion, creating a true-family school project and initiating a social-image transformation.

For section two, WFWP, UPF, One Korea (the national union for unification of Korea), and Youth Federation for World Peace and FFWPU reported their strategies for Vision 2020.

The Korean Women's Federation plans to build a friendly network between 20,000 regular members and 300,000 associates. Particularly, Women's Federation plans to recruit female college students through global UN volunteering. They plan to build local campus branches in Korea, one in Seoul and one in Sun Moon University.

UPF declared four strategic objectives: a peace ambassador movement, a peace unification movement, spreading volunteer works, and spreading True Parents' peace vision. UPF also plans to train and cultivate 100,000 peace ambassadors by 2020.

One Korea plans to expand the national unification [of Korea] education, prepare for the unification of Korea and to train future Unification leaders. In order to achieve these goals, One Korea is cultivating cooperative relationship with government and educating youth.



Mr. Young Ho Yoon reported about special reports.

Youth Federation for World Peace made a goal to train 100,000 existing church members through "Youth Dream Maker" program, which includes the theme "peace, unification and purity." The organization plans to organize talent contribution, establish local club forums, and build 43 foreign-youth networks.

As part of its strategy to train 600,000 Cheon II Guk civilians, the Family Federation (FFWPU) reported a variety of strategy- and support plans. FFWPU also shared various activities that were possible because of the organic connection between big churches and Hoon Dok churches.



Mr. Kwang Seok Song reported the goals of One Korea

After the report from each providential organization, the participants moved on to section three which was discussion.

Section four included the worldwide progress report. Mr. Seong Il Jo, Director of the Missionary Department, reported diverse activities in the 43 strategic nations and providential nations.

During section five, Mr. Seong Il Jo and Mr. Young Ho Yoon gave a special report. They reported the progress of their individual projects and shared the mission of all field missionaries.
