**The First Global Assembly for CARP University Students
November 2, 1984, Little Angels Performing Arts Center**

Around 3,000 CARP members partook in the First Global Assembly for CARP University Students, which was held under the theme, “One World under God” from November 2 to 8, 1984. During the assembly, a symposium entitled, “University Student Values Regarding World Peace,” a friendship ceremony between Korean and Japanese students and a sports festival to bring about harmony and unity among the global CARP membership were held. **Establishment of the Inter-Denominational Christian Association
November 7, 1966, A-seo-won, Jung-gu, Seoul**

A ceremony marking the foundation of the Inter-Denominational Christian Association was held on November 7, 1966 at A-seo-won, in Jung-gu, Seoul. This was the result of the Christianity based inter-denominational activities that had been held since 1965. True Father said, “If a hundred members become people central to creating harmony, they can be remembered by Heaven. To bring about harmony, inter-denominational activities must be carried out to a degree where one would even fall into debt for it.” When first established, it was launched under the name the “Christian Inter-Denominational Movement Headquarters” but was renamed the “Inter-Denominational Christian Association” eight years later in October 1974.
