### Vacancy

#### Young Adults Ministry Leader for the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification UK

Our church community is changing rapidly. The second generation of our movement are increasingly taking up leading roles. Already over half of second generation are over the age of 18 and by 2020 70% will over the age of 23. Soon they will form the bulk of our movement. We are in a crucial time of transition.



Young Adults Ministry exists to make True Parents teachings relevant to their life and to support them as they go through what can be a challenging time from being a teenager to being a full adult, through university, getting matched, the beginning of married life and on into the world of work. A time when people decide what values to lead their life by and whether God is going to be a part of it.

In response to this we have been developing projects in three main areas – CARP, Young couples and Life at Work: with CARP we now have an increasingly established network of local leaders piloting small groups in their regions;

there are now regular groups of young husbands and young wives meeting to share testimonies and experiences; and seminars held exploring what relevance the values of Principle bring to the workplace and to personal finance.

True Mother has spoken recently about the need to ‘embrace people around you by creating a suitable environment, and become a model family to the young people in society’. In order to be that model we must invest in one another and create programs what transform lives – then we will have something to contribute to society.

### Job Description

**Job Title:** Young Adults Ministry Leader

**Responsible to:** the National Leader of FFWPU UK

### Role Purpose

The Young Adults Ministry Leader is responsible to continue developing creative programs and resources to educate the young adult demographic in our movement and support them to realise God's purpose for their life.

### Key Responsibilities

- Develop understanding of the relevance of True Parent's Words and the Principle to key areas of the lives of the young adults of our community –university, workplace and relationships.
- Assist the National Leader and other National Departments in shaping activities for young adults
- Develop and initiate relationships with key partners to run a well-rounded program of events throughout the year
- Support regions in their young adults' ministry (resources, training and mentoring)
- Continue to support local CARP leaders and develop CARP activities
- Cooperate with the Blessed Family Department to support the Matching and Blessing of young adults



### Qualities, Skills and Experience

We're looking for a key combination of skills: someone with good interpersonal skills to develop relationships with key partners and the wider community; and someone with the project management skills to execute a variety of programs and projects.

We are not necessarily after someone who is a great public speaker. Most of we're looking for someone with a love for God and passion for serving others.

### Terms and conditions

This is a full-time role based in FFWPU UK headquarters in London. We anticipate the salary will be
