True Parents' Meeting with Kim Il Sung December 6, 1991, Hamheung, North Korea

On December 6, True Parents had a historic meeting with Kim Il Sung at Jusuk Palace in Majeon, Hamheung. They exchanged a letter of agreement for peaceful unification based on a joint statement that contained ten articles regarding such promises as the hosting of a North Korean–South Korean summit meeting, peaceful resolution to the issue of North Korea's nuclear armament and the hosting of reunions between the ten million separated Korean family members. In his statement, True Father said, “I am not going to the house of my enemy but rather that of my homeland, and that of my brother.”

Establishment of the Korean Cultural Foundation December 9, 1969, Seoul, Korea

The Korean Cultural Foundation was established in Seoul on December 9, 1969 in order to support Little Angels, which had been enhancing the nation's prestige by promoting Korean culture around the world. Following True Parents' instructions, our Korean elders created a foundation to manage the Little Angels. They obtained permission from the Ministry of Culture in December 1969.

**True Mother's Speech in Brazil
December 9, 1993, Brasilia, Brazil**

On December 9, 1993, True Mother delivered the first speech during her tour in South America under the theme, "True Parents and the Completed Testament Age" at the Naun Plaza Hotel in Brasillia, Brazil. Senator Humberto Lucena welcomed True Mother as she took the podium. She received a big round of applause after she emphasized the importance of a mother's role in the Completed Testament Age. True Mother spoke in Montevideo, Uruguay, on the 10th, in Buenos Aires, Argentina on the 11th, and Lima, Peru on the 13th.
