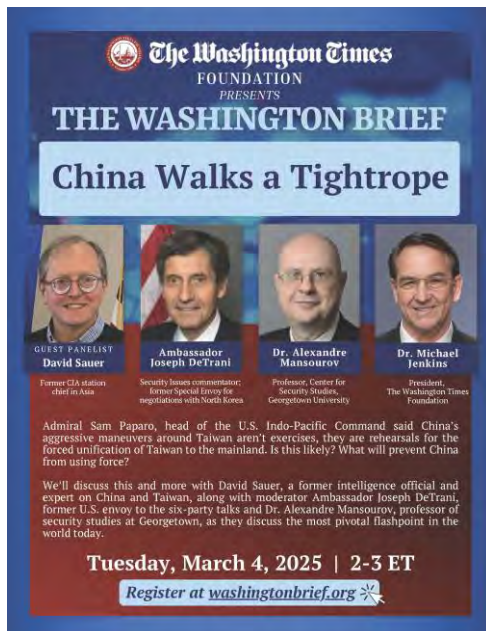

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China Walks a Tightrope with Taiwan

Balancing power projection ambitions with a troubled economy and wary neighbors

Tuesday, March 4, 2025 from 2 to 3 PM EST

Admiral Sam Paparo, head of the U.S. Indo-Pacific Command said China's aggressive maneuvers around Taiwan aren't exercises, they are rehearsals for the forced unification of Taiwan to the mainland. Is this likely? What will prevent China from using force?

We'll discuss this and more with **David Sauer**, former intelligence official and expert on China and Taiwan, along with moderator **Ambassador Joseph DeTrani**, former U.S. envoy to the six-party talks and **Dr. Alexandre Mansourov**, professor of security studies at Georgetown, as they discuss the most pivotal flashpoint in the world today.
