SCHEDULE

Arrival: 22rd June 2013 Programme duration: **23th June - 20th July 2013** (Requests to arrive earlier and stay for longer can be granted)

For the first three weeks, you will be living alongside CARP members in Tokyo, and taking part in activities such as teaching English, witnessing, helping with workshops etc. - depending on where you are located.

In the final week, you will be sightseeing around Hiroshima, Kyoto, and Tokyo. Lodging will be in CARP houses at these locations.

After the programme you are free to stay in Japan, travel abroad or fly home.

This is the basic schedule organised, but ideas and suggestions are welcome.

EXPENSES

£1000 will cover: Flights, JR Pass £190(Japanese Rail Pass), Lodging for sightseeing (6000 yen for 6 days)

Lodging and food will be organised by CARP for the three weeks.

England-Japan-England – Flight cost - approximately £650 England-Japan-Korea-England- Flight cost-approximately £850 (Korean Airways, Asiana)

There are limited vacancies this year, therefore early booking is vital!
