The main topic, a discussion of a man who had an unexpected life and encounter with God, Moses. After hiding her baby for a few month, Moses' mother put him in a wicker basket which floated in the Nile river and discovered by the Pharoah's daughter. He was raised in two worlds, the Hebrew world of his mother who was tasked to nurse him and the world of the Pharoah's court.

Consequently, Moses was a child of 2 cultures with very different values. He must have struggled many

times about how he really didn't fit in either one. He could have lived a very comfortable life as an Egyptian prince. He may have wanted to do something to help his Hebrew relatives but felt powerless to do much.

His sense of justice led him to defend a mistreated Hebrew slave and to killing an Egyptian. When he was forced to flee to Midian he must have felt like a failure.

I am sure that there are times when you tried to do something that didn't turn out well, even if you did that for the best of reasons. Right? Did God think Moses was a failure or did God think that Moses had an inner core of goodness that needed more training?

Moses could have had a pity party about his colossal failure, but when he saw how the 7 daughters of the priest were unfairly treated at the well, he defended them, displaying his core nature of courage and justice. This is a good lesson. Even when we have reasons to be sad or depressed, get out and do something and help someone!

So Moses became a shepherd for nearly 40 years. When he saw something burning on the mountain, he could have said, "I might get into trouble if I go up on this mountain. That's what his wife Zipporah thought. Or it might disturb the traditions of my adopted family. What will people say if I tell them what I actually saw?"

Many times we see something that needs to be fixed or feel the Holy Spirit pushing us to do something, but we are tempted to make up an excuse to justify not acting on that inspiration. We might say, "I'm not qualified. I don't have permission. Etc.) I'm not saying to rush into something without thinking things out, but we should admire Moses because he had curiosity and courage.

God was telling him, "you are not only a shepherd." You are not only what you do. Isn't it common for people to base their identity on what they do? On their job? On their position in society? That is not God's point of view. That said, it's true that doing is part of faith, too. It's not all in your head.

Moses was thinking, "I DON'T THINK SO! The last time I tried, I messed everything up!" Don't we often do the same thing? We think "I messed up last time, so I better not try!"

Moses asked God whom should he say sent him to liberate the Israelites. God told him, "Say this to the people of Israel: 'I AM has sent me to you.'"

So it seems that God has a name. What about you? Who do you say you are? What does God call you? I'm not talking about the name others call you. Have you asked God "what do you call me?" Wouldn't that be good to know?

Earlier in the Bible, the Book of Genesis tells the story of Jacob wrestling all night with an angel of God and demanding that God bless him. God gives him a new name, saying "Your name shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with men, and have prevailed." Genesis 32:22-28

God tells that from that time onward He shall be known as the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. God identifies Himself with 3 IMPERFECT MEN who struggled to understand and do what God wanted, but did respond to His call. Do you think God stopped calling people? No, God is still looking for imperfect people who will respond to His call.

A bigger truth is that when God chooses someone for a mission, He often tries to put him or her in a life-threatening situation. Similarly, Exodus 4:24-26 states, "At a lodging place on the way the LORD met [Moses] and sought to put him to death." Zipporah finds a way to save her husband's life by cutting off their son's foreskin and touching Moses' feet with it.

Zipporah saved her husband's life! But the bigger point is that when God chooses someone for a mission, He will give you a difficult, even life-threatening trial first!

As a passage from Romans 8:19-22 tells us, the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God. Are you and I the children of God? Were we reborn into the lineage of God? Don't you think that those aspiring to be children of God will have some challenges, maybe even be attacked by Satan?

True Father spoke about God striking those He calls many times. Here are a few of his words:

God always strikes His loving children first and then strikes Satan.

Heavenly strategy is to be struck and take things away from Satan. When you are struck, be struck well.

Take responsibility even in the saddest, most unfair and mortifying situation. If you are determined in that way, all trials will pass away.

Just as stronger light casts stronger shadows, harsher trials yield stronger graces.

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In the Family Pledge that True Father left for us there is a repeated phrase.

Each section of the pledge starts with "Our Family, **the owner of Cheon Il Guk.**"

At the Second Coming the Messiah invited us to share the way he viewed things, the way he thinks, and to share his mission. What is the difference between an owner or a renter? If the roof is leaking, does a renter fix the roof?

No, it's the owner who fixes the roof or builds a new extension. So an owner of God's nation, the Kingdom of Heaven, wants to take care of it, because it belongs to you. So if you see something wrong in what you own, you and I are the fixers! That's why Father called us tribal messiahs, or in Regis' case, a national messiah. But it's up to you, and me and all of us if we want to say 'yes.'"



What about the larger society? A [documentary about the breakdown of the marriage system in China](#) is a

big warning, but it could be about Korea, Japan, the U.S. or many other countries as well.

Even though there are 30 more million men in China than women, many Chinese women can't find men who want to marry them, and vice versa. What's missing in this picture? Isn't it the spiritual dimension?

Of course, the same thing is happening here in America. If men and women were gathering to worship God in local churches, don't you think more would get married? Doesn't the Bible and the Divine Principle have something to say about this? Chinese culture and American culture often puts material success first. Is that the right order?
